PinkDrive Partner with BD to Mobilise Critical Health Screening to Close the Cancer Care Gap

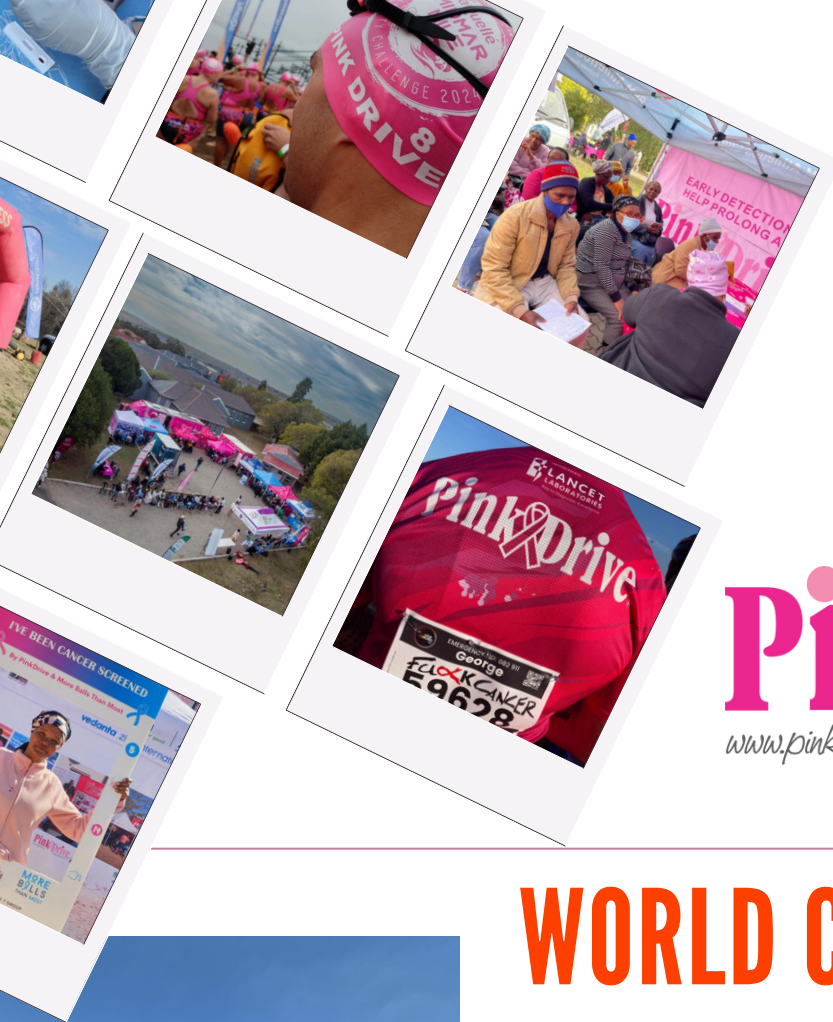
Soweto, South Africa – February 4, 2025
